How to weather the financial storm

path, it's time to batten down, don life jackets, and prepare for a ride – actively sailing in heavy weather is preferable to passively riding out the

It seems that these guidelines can be fruitfully applied to management in a recession: develop scenarios, segment and compete where the storm is less intense and, finally, confront the storm actively by making necessary adjustments (eg capacity).
